Corning's Lingyan Wang Selected For The 2023 Women To Watch Summit

Corning Inventor Lingyan Wang holds 10 U.S. patents and several international patents. In addition, she has produced 52 publications with over 6,000 citations. Her interest in nanostructured materials led to ceramics research. After joining **Corning Inc.**, she designed a magnetic nanoparticle for biological separation, which launched as a product for the cleanup required to remove the mineral oil, dyes, salts, and other impurities from DNA samples. While working on research projects, she often joins volunteers at the Corning Museum of Glass. In addition, she supports summer science fairs for high school students and college interns at Corning and serves in the Corning Technology Women's Network.
